Rotary Corporate Member Benefits

A Rotary Corporate Membership will provide the opportunity to sponsor two members for participation in the Club. The corporate members will be provided the same rights and obligations as individual members.

The primary member will be drawn from the senior executive group. The associate member will be appointed by the senior member and together will develop their own specialized strategy for participation in Club activities.

The Club executive will work with your corporation to tailor its participation in the Club – working together to align and support the needs of both parties.

Key Membership Criteria

your corporation will have one primary and one associate members

the primary member, and the Club, will participate in a screening process to ensure an appropriate "fit" between the two organizations; the associate member will be selected by the primary member

the annual corporate membership cost is 180% of the individual member rate as set from time to time by the Board of Directors of the Club

corporate members are expected to purchase a minimum of 50 lunch tickets.

Rotary Basics

Rotary International, the world's first service club organization, is made up of over 32,000 clubs in more than 200 countries and geographical areas. Its members form a global network of business and professional leaders who volunteer their time and talents to serve their communities and the world.

Rotary's motto, Service Above Self, exemplifies the humanitarian spirit of the organization's more than 1.2 million members. Strong fellowship among Rotarians and meaningful community and international service projects characterize Rotary worldwide.

Rotary enjoys a rich and sometimes complex tradition and organizational structure, with many programs and customs that appeal to the new and even not-so-new members.

Beyond Community service, Rotary activities include fellowship, social activities and the opportunity to form strong, lifelong friendships.

The Organization of Rotary

Rotary is essentially a grassroots organization, with most of its service efforts being carried out at the club level. The district and international structure is designed to support the clubs and help them provide more service in their communities and abroad. (see www.rotary.org)

Clubs: Rotarians are members of Rotary clubs, which belong to the global association of Rotary International (RI). Each club elects its own officers and enjoys considerable autonomy within the framework of Rotary's constitution and bylaws.

Districts: Clubs are grouped into 530 RI districts, each led by a district governor, who is an officer of RI. The district administration, including assistant governors and various committees, guides and supports the clubs.

RI Board: The 19-member RI Board of Directors, which includes the RI president and president-elect, meets quarterly to establish policies. Traditionally, the RI president, who is elected annually, develops a theme and emphasis for the year.

The Secretariat: Rotary International is headquartered in the Chicago suburb of Evanston, Illinois, USA, with seven international offices.

Responsibilities of Club Membership

The club is the cornerstone of Rotary, where the most meaningful work is carried out. All effective Rotary clubs are responsible for four key elements:

1. participating in service projects that benefit their community and those in other countries;
2. supporting The Rotary Foundation financially and through program participation;
3. developing leaders capable of serving in Rotary beyond the club level; and
4. sustaining or increasing the membership base.

What Rotarians get out of Rotary depends largely on what they put into it. Many membership requirements are designed to help members more fully participate in and enjoy their Rotary experience.



Rotary's Guiding Principles

The Object of Rotary is to encourage and foster the ideal of service as a basis of worthy enterprise and, in particular, to encourage and foster:

the development of acquaintance as an opportunity for service;

high ethical standards in business and professions; the recognition of the worthiness of all useful occupations; and the dignifying of each Rotarian's occupation as an opportunity to serve society;

the application of the ideal of service in each Rotarian's personal, business, and community life; and

the advancement of international understanding, goodwill and peace through a world fellowship of business and professional persons united in the ideal of service.

History

The Club has been in existence since 1958 and has a proud history of fundraising and assisting worthwhile causes within the City of Halifax, the Province of Nova Scotia, and around the world. Our Club meets for lunch on Wednesday at 12:15 p.m., at the Citadel Halifax Hotel.

Members are expected to maintain 60% attendance – which can be constituted through attendance at our weekly lunch meetings, or committee work, or working at hands-on projects, and through attendance at other Rotary Club meetings; there is also an E-club on line attendance make-up site.

Our Club is governed by its President and Board of Directors with assistance from the Club Secretary and Treasurer.
